- A. Supreme Court decision that overruled, for the first, a law passed by Congress that had been signed by George Washington; Chief Justice John Marshall, a Federalist, claimed that the Supreme Court had the right to decide if laws were constitutional; this is called "judicial review..."
- B. The Supreme Court upheld broad congressional power to regulate interstate commerce. The Court's broad interpretation of the Constitution's commerce clause paved the way for later rulings upholding expansive federal powers.
- C. Held that Native Americans were entitled to federal protection from the actions of state governments which would infringe on the tribe's sovereignty; ignored by the Jackson administration.
- D. Maryland was trying to tax the national bank and Supreme Court ruled that federal law was stronger than the state law
- E. Supreme Court decision that stated slaves were not citizens: slaves were property no matter where they were living and the Missouri Compromise unconstitutional
