# **Grade Calculation in US History**

There are three categories of assignments in this class. Daily Work, Projects/Presentations, Exams

Daily Work: Each assignment will be calculated once.

These types of assignments may include daily work in class, homework, vocabulary quizzes given online, and collaborative work given in class. Other types of daily work will be given throughout the year.

Projects/Presentations: Each assignment will be calculated once.

Most projects assigned will be completed in class in a collaborative environment.

Presentations consist of memorizing and presenting, in class, several assigned speeches, pledges, or famous documents from American History. Some examples include The Pledge of Allegiance, Patrick Henry's Liberty or Death speech, and the Preamble to the Constitution. There will be at least one presentation assignment per six-week period and a rubric will be provided for each presentation assigned.

Exams: Each exam will be calculated twice.

### **Late Work Policy**

Late work will only be accepted per the guidelines of the Student Handbook.

Exam improvement opportunities will be given to each student. Students will have the opportunity to earn ½ of the deduced points on any given exam. Please see the Student Handbook for further information on exam improvement policies and procedures.
