Late work will be accepted one day late for an 85. Two days late will receive a 70. Three to five days late, the highest grade will be a 50. After one week, the work will not be accepted. Any late assignment that is graded for completion will receive no higher than a 50. Any test or quiz that you score less than 70 on may be retaken. The retest must be completed within 1 week of receiving the graded test back and the highest grade you can score is a 70.

Absent Work

In the event that a student is absent, they need to talk to the teacher to find out what they missed. Students are strongly encouraged to attend tutorials following an absence. We cover something new almost every day and students are responsible for what was taught even if they were absent. Absences do not excuse you from knowing the material. If a student knows in advance they will be out, they are responsible for getting their work in advance. If a student is absent the day of a test, they will take the test the 1st day they return. If they are absent the day of the review, they will get the review, and then take the test the following day.
