

BRAZOS ISD SAFETY AND SECURITY MEETING MINUTES
November 28, 2022

1. Establish a quorum – Call to Order: The Brazos ISD Safety and Security Team held a Regular Meeting on Wednesday, November 28, 2022 in the Brazos ISD Central Administration Office Board Room. Superintendent, Scott Rogers, began the meeting at 11:35 AM. Committee members present were, Bradley Reinecker, Brazos ISD; JR Prado, Brazos ISD; Lutenient Rob Lockett, Austin County Sheriff's Office; Eric Cormier, BHS Principal; Myles Marek, Brazos ISD Board of Trustees; David Fischer; Wallis Police Department; James Ressler, Fort Bend County Sheriff's Office; Jessie Nanes, Brazos ISD Technology; Clay Hudgins, Brazos ISD Administration; Eddy Flores, Wallis Police Department; Kim Etheridge, Brazos ISD Administration; Roy Mercer, Austin County Emergency Management; Denise Darracq, Austin County Security; Chad Norvell, Fort Bend County Constable; Teresa Ressler, Brazos ISD Administration; Chad Divin, BHS Teacher and Scott Rogers, Brazos ISD Superintendent.

2. Introductions/Sign In: Brazos ISD Superintendent, Scott Rogers, welcomed everyone to the meeting and reminded all attendees to sign in on the sheet provided. BHS Principal, Eric Cormier, led introductions.

3. Approval of August 10, 2022 meeting minutes: This item was taken after item 5. Eric Cormier moved with a second by Myles Marek to approve the minutes of the August 10, 2022 meeting. The motion passed unanimously.

4. Presentation and discussion only

4.1 Review of SSSC's purpose, membership, and responsibilities: Eric Cormier, reviewed the purpose of the School Safety and Security Committee.

4.2 Review, discuss and recommendations pertaining to the Fall 2022 Safety & Security Audit: Scott Rogers organized the committee into five groups to review and discuss areas of the Fall 2022 Safety & Security Audit. Once the groups were completed their review, each group leader discussed bullet points of their review. Group 1 - District Neighborhood Risk Factors recommended alarm systems at all schools, relocate the BES playground to the back of the school, institute card key access, increase number of BMS cameras; Group 2 – Brazos Elementary School discussed fencing concerns at that campus; Group 3 –

Brazos Middle School discussed a sign in and out system, security cameras with further span, and fencing at BMS; Group 4 – Brazos High School discussed how the BHS camera system is more security than surveillance and ways that can be improved, the guardian program and a way to communicate with law enforcement who the guardians are in case of a security issue, swipe cards, Raptor contacting Austin or Fort Bend County, fencing for ag area. Group 5 – District discussed fencing requirements for the ag area, either 6-foot high with scalable prevention or 8-foot high fence.

4.3 Review proposed revisions to Chapter 61 of the Texas Administrative Code concerning school facilities: Scott Rogers reviewed revisions to Chapter 61 of the Texas Administrative Code concerning school facilities; fencing requirements and door numbering were discussed.

4.4: Review of SPAT grant: Teresa Ressler, Director of Curriculum & Instruction reviewed requirements of the SILENT PANIC ALERT TECHNOLOGY (SPAT) GRANT. The LEA must implement a communications infrastructure, which shall include a panic alert button, duress, or equivalent alarm system. RAPTOR was evaluated to meet the standards of the grant.

4.5 Discuss and plan to meet required training on Psychological First Aid [TEC 37.108(f)(6)(C)(i)]: Scott Rogers informed the committee that members take Psychological First Aid online. Brazos ISD employees are required to and will start the training on this program.

5. The next Safety & Security meeting will be scheduled for March: The next meeting is scheduled for March 20, 2023.

7. Adjourn: Clay Hudgins moved with a second by Eric Cormier to adjourn the meeting. The motion passed unanimously. The meeting was adjourned at 12:38PM.
