**Course Description:** World History will be an in-depth study of our past, with an emphasis put on people and events that changed society then and how they affect society now.

### **Student Expectations:**

Students are expected to make a commitment to manage their time wisely, read, study, take notes, ask questions, think on their own, be organized, read outside material, problem solve, and be an active and positive contributor to each class period.

**Technology in the Classroom:** Per district policy, all personal electronic devices will be turned off during the day unless, including during all testing. A student must have approval to possess other devices such as netbooks, laptops, tablets or other portable devices. If used without authorization, the first offense is confiscation and a \$15 fine for the parent to pick up at the end of the day from the principal's office, or can, wait three days and pick up without the \$15 fee. Second offense is three days of confiscation and a \$15 to pick up from the principal's office, or wait eight days to pick up without the fine. The third offense is a \$15, six weeks confiscation, or the student can wait an extra two weeks to pick up the device without a \$15 fine.
