#### What We're Learning

Week 1: Getting Started

Students will review the course syllabus, join Google Classroom, and participate in fun community-building activities like Six-Word Memoirs and "Whodunit?" They'll also complete The Letter Project, an introduction to tell me more about themselves. Weeks 2–3: Skills Development

We'll dive into vocabulary (connotation vs. denotation), inference, synthesis, and author's purpose. Students will work with passages like "Old Ironsides" and tackle collaborative challenges such as solving a "murder mystery" using inference. Weeks 4–5: Memoir Study – Unusual Normality

This moving personal essay by Ishmael Beah helps students analyze theme, tone, central idea, and figurative language. They'll complete a test and write a short constructed response (SCR) using textual evidence.

Week 6: Essay Writing + CBA

Students will draft, revise, and peer-review an essay. Then, they'll complete their first Curriculum-Based Assessment to check their understanding of key reading and writing skills.
