COURSE FORMAT: The course will consist of lecture, class discussion, group and individual exercises, projects, and hands-on activities.

Class participation grades will be based on the following scale:

100-90: Student exhibits on-task behavior for the entirety of the class period 89-80: Student exhibits on-task behavior for the majority of the class period 79-70: Student exhibits off-task behavior for the majority of the class period 69 and less: Student exhibits off-task behavior for the entirety of the class period

ATTENDANCE: Regular attendance is strongly advised due to the fast-pace of this course. Campus attendance guidelines will be enforced to include tardy policy. Daily "Bell Ringers"

are to be completed EACH DAY to receive attendance credit, as well as any other assignments that are given. Attendance will be checked each period and at the end of each school day.
